Adult Foster Care: Adult Foster Care is a licensed home-like setting for adults who are unable to live on their own. Placements may be short-term, long-term or for respite care.

Blood Pressure Checks and Foot Care Clinics: Public Health Nurses perform blood pressure checks and hold monthly low-cost foot care clinics for elderly persons. Appointments are required. **MNCHOICES**-Web-based application that is comprehensive and integrates assessment and support planning for Minnesotans who need long-term services and supports. MNCHOICES embraces a person-centered approach to ensure services meet each person's strengths, goals, preferences, and assessed needs.
